## SAFETY MESSAGE FROM SDG&E®



Adverse weather conditions forecasted for Monday morning through Tuesday, September 28-29, 2020, indicate increased wildfire risk that may affect the power lines serving local communities. These conditions may require us to turn off power to reduce the risk of a wildfire. If power is turned off, it will remain off until conditions are safe for restoration. When possible, we'll notify potentially impacted customers 48 hours in advance of power being turned off.

### What you need to know

Safety is our highest priority and we understand the inconvenience you may experience as a result of potential outages. Here are some things you should know about potential power shutoffs in your area:

- ▶ We're continuously monitoring weather and wildfire risk conditions and will contact those impacted with further updates
- ▶ If power is shut off, we expect to restore it within 24 to 48 hours, in most cases, after high fire risk weather conditions have passed
- ▶ Depending on weather conditions, or if repairs are needed, power outages could last longer than 48 hours. For planning purposes, we encourage you to prepare for multiple day outages

It is important to take proactive steps when preparing for potential power outages and other emergencies. Here are some things you can do to be more prepared:
