The series is a breakthrough in Indigenous representation on TV, both in front of and behind the camera: every writer, director and series regular is Indigenous. Throughout its first two seasons, *Reservation Dogs* landed on 180+ critics' year-end best lists and was honored with numerous accolades, including two Independent Spirit Awards and a Peabody Award.
